INTRODUCTION

THE LIFE OF RUTH: LOSS, LOYALTY AND LOVE

HEAR THE WORD

READ THE WORD

Read the entire book of **Ruth** (chapters 1-4) in one sitting in the translation from which you typically read or study.

Ruth is set in the period of the Judges, though we are unsure exactly when. If you are unfamiliar with the period of the Judges, read Judges 2 to gain a brief back-story into this period. ('Our PW Ministry Study "Strong and Courageous" covers the book of Joshua--a time period that leads right up to the Judges. In fact, Othniel served as the first judge of Israel and is introduced in the book of Joshua.)

STUDY THE WORD

- 1. Who wrote the book of Ruth and who are the main characters?
- 2. What genre of literature is the book of Ruth?
- 3. When did the events of Ruth take place? Since we are not entirely certain of exact dates, skim through the book of Judges and make a chronological list of the judges.
- 4. Where did the events of Ruth take place?
- 5. Why do you think it's important to study the Bible? As you go through this study, keep a list of reasons you discern God speaks to you through the book of Ruth. (Your list will be different than my list and the others doing this study with you.)

Read **Ruth 1** each day for five days. Read the ESV translation on three days and choose two additional translations the remaining days. At least two times this week add **Genesis 19:30-38** and **Deuteronomy 23:3-4** to your reading.

Highlight differences between different translations and circle words/phrases that interest or intrigue you for further study.

STUDY THE WORD

- 1. How did Naomi end up in Moab?
- 2. What do you think the average Israelite thought about the Moabites?
- 3. Why do you think Ruth was willing to follow Naomi back to Bethlehem?
- 4. Read Exodus 22: 15-25. How does these verses correlate to Naomi?
- 5. Are you able to identify any places of bitterness in your own life?
- 6. How are you asking God to move to make your bitter situation sweet again? Pray right now and ask him.

Boaz is a "Christ-Type" character in scripture.


Describe below what this means and how Boaz exhibits Christ-like attributes.

READ THE WORD

Read **Ruth 3** each day for five days. Read the ESV translation on three days and choose two additional translations the remaining days.

Highlight differences between different translations and circle words/phrases that interest or intrigue you for further study.

STUDY THE WORD

- 1. In verse one we see Naomi is seeking "rest" for Ruth. Given the context of this passage, what do you think Naomi means by "rest"?
- 2. Much of chapter three (3) centers on the idea of a "redeemer". The Hebrew word is go'el. Look these passages up and write down one thing you learn about the concept of redemption in the Old Testament: **hint—you may need to read a few verses before or after for context (Genesis 48: 16, Exodus 6:6, Leviticus 27:9-25, Leviticus 25:47-55)
- 3. How does Old Testament redemption compare to the redemption Christ offers us?
- 4. How will being redeemed provide "rest" for Ruth?

STUDY THE WORD

- 1. After reading the entire chapter for several days, write down five (5) differences between the way Boaz came to marry Ruth and the way modern day men and women come to marriage.
- 2. Are there any practical things we learn about marriage, as followers of Christ, from this chapter?
- 3. Look up these passages and write a one-sentence summary about each passage:
 - a. Genesis 35:16-20
 - b. Ruth 2: 8-9
 - c.1 Samuel 16:10-12
 - d. Luke 2:8-11
- 4. All of these passages occur in the same PLACE, known today as the Shepherd's Fields. Is there a place in your life where God speaks to you or moves in your life on a regular basis?
